Waivers & Forms

Each camper must have a completed form which includes the Day Camp Booking Form, Code of Conduct, and the Release Form. Camp forms must be completed by a child's parent or legal guardian. Forms can be found online at:

Where to Meet

All campers must be signed in and out of camp by a parent, guardian, or previously authorized adult. Sign in and out is conducted at the Summer Kitchen of the Hanna Log House. Please park in the south parking lot and walk all campers onto the site.

Lunch and Snacks

Please send your child with a labeled water bottle. Pack at least two snacks and a lunch for the day. Keep in mind that we don't have access to a microwave, so avoid sending lunches that need to be heated. Make sure to include enough food, as the kids will be quite active throughout the day.

Fees

Fees will be processed once we receive your registration form. We accept cash, cheque, debit, Visa, Mastercard, and eTransfer. Please make cheques payable to Sunnybrook Farm Museum, and send eTransfers to sbfs@shaw.ca (we have autodeposit)



What to Wear

Please dress your child in comfortable play clothes suitable for the weather. For safety, all children must wear closed-toed shoes, as they may be around old farm equipment. Sunnybrook Farm Museum spans 10 acres, and we aim to spend as much time outdoors as possible. Make sure all your child's belongings are labeled with their name.

Lost and Found

Staff will lay out lost items from the week during pick-up. Please check the table daily for your child's belongings. Items will be stored in the supply trailer over the summer, and any unclaimed items by the end of September will be donated to a local charity.

Early Drop Off & Late Pick Up

Unfortunately, we no longer offer this service. Camp hours are from 9:00 AM to 4:30 PM.

Cancellations

Camp fees are non-refundable within two weeks of the camp start date. Cancellations made more than two weeks in advance will incur a \$25 administration fee. You can switch your booking to a different day or week with a doctor's note or one week's notice, without any penalty or extra fees, subject to availability.

Sunnybrook Farm Museum celebrates the early days of Alberta farming. Find your rural roots as you explore Red Deer's oldest farm! Imagine the 19ives of pioneer farm families - working in the field, milking the family cow in the dairy barn, repairing a plow in the blacksmith shop, or baking break in the summer kitchen.

Join us as we travel back in time. Chat with "men at work" in the restoration shop. Experience the modern conveniences - of 1905 - on a visit to the log house. Try your hand at milking our cow "Betsy" and enjoy a wagon ride. At special events you can also experience demonstrations of lovingly restored farming equipment (seasonal).
